

DEWITT SCHOOL BOARD

Facilities Public Hearing
6:00 P.M. November 10, 2015

The Board of Directors of the DeWitt School District met for a Public Hearing on the Six-Year master plan and its regular monthly meeting on November 10, 2015, in the DeWitt Elementary cafeteria.

The Public Hearing was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Brad Koen. Others present were Vice-president Drew Whiting, Secretary Shawanna Wansley, and Board Members April Herring, and Johnny Lockley, along with Superintendent Dr. Lynne Dardenne. Kenneth Graves and Bruce Morgan were absent.

Jeff Rader presented the districts six-year master plan to those in attendance. The plan will be voted on at the December board meeting.

Transcript of Facilities Public Hearing: Public Comments

Comment 1 – “What are you talking about when you start talking about renovating for STEM? Are we talking about laboratories? How many classrooms are over there now? It is like I told Jeff, I need 20 more feet to my classroom. Science has changed in the way it is taught. It is a building process now. Between AP physics and AP chemistry and what we do with robotics sometimes I can’t have labs. Chemistry could stay where it is and not that much remodeling would have to occur for physics.”

Comment 2 – “Has any conversation taken place about what will happen when we move into the new middle school? I did not know if there was a timetable? So, we are not in a rush to get out of that building?”

Comment 3 – “Are you looking at how us being able to pay for our part of the projects. Is that something we will be able to do or will another increase in millage be needed? I wish at the elementary school we had those automatic on/off for sinks.”

No additional public comments were made.
